Introduction

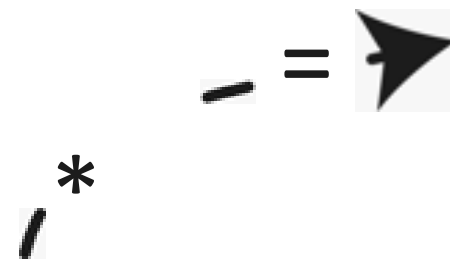
Corruption is one of the greatest threats to the development of society, state and economy. It reduces the efficiency of governance and leads to inequality. However, for a successful fight against corruption, it is important to understand its ethical aspects. Today we will consider how anti-corruption and ethics are interconnected, and why ethical principles are critically important for an effective fight against corruption



Definition of concepts

Anticorruption is a system of measures aimed at preventing detecting and punishing corrupt acts. This may include legislative initiatives, control over public spending as well as education and upbringing of citizens.

Ethics is a system of moral principles that regulates human behavior in society. Ethical norms determine what is right and what is wrong in a particular context.



Ethical standards:

The fight against corruption is based on ethical principles such as honesty, transparency, and accountability

Legislation and ethics

- Anti-corruption legislation aims not only to punish corrupt acts, but also to establish ethical standards for civil servants and businessmen

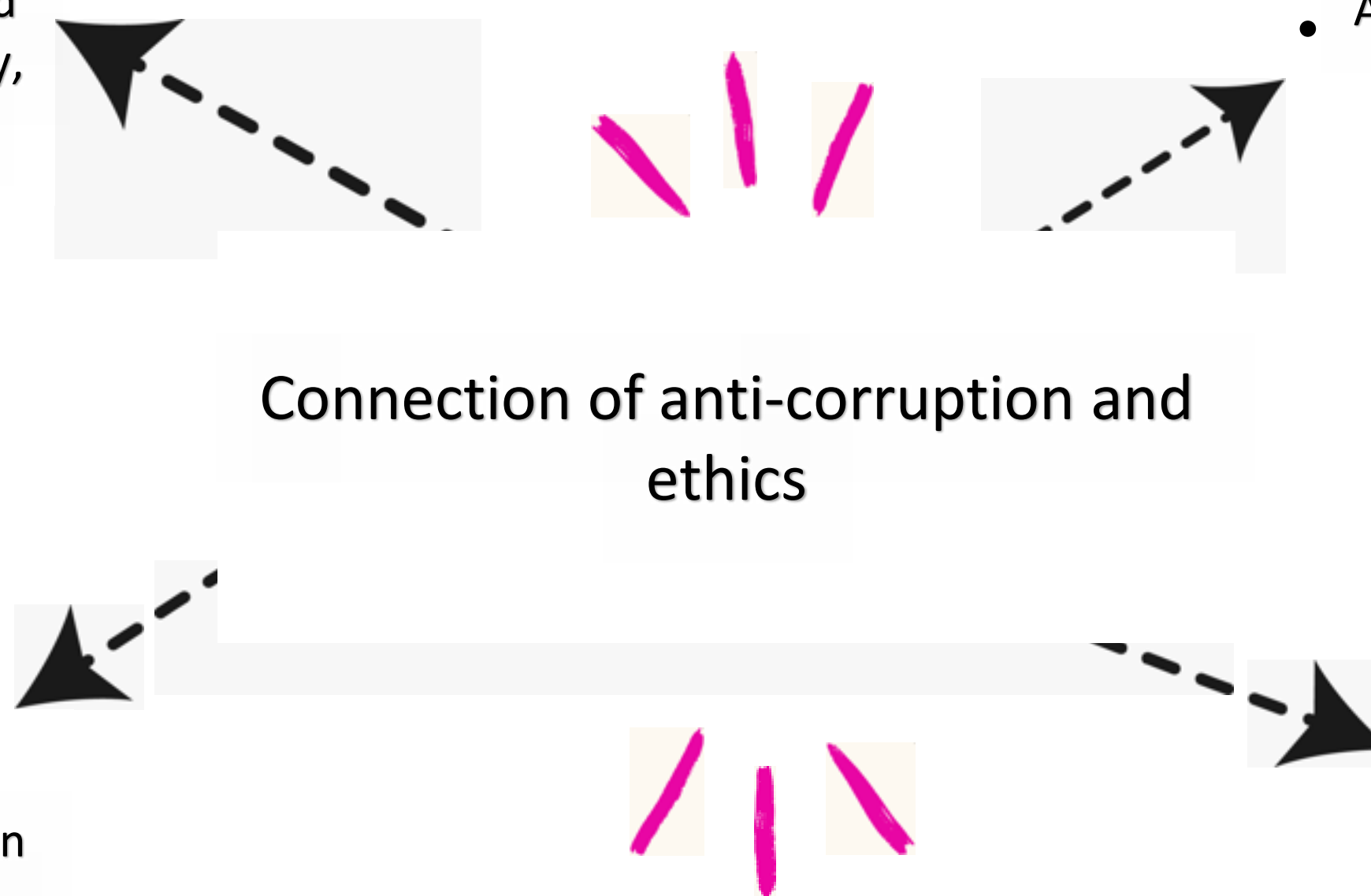
Connection of anti-corruption and ethics

Education of consciousness

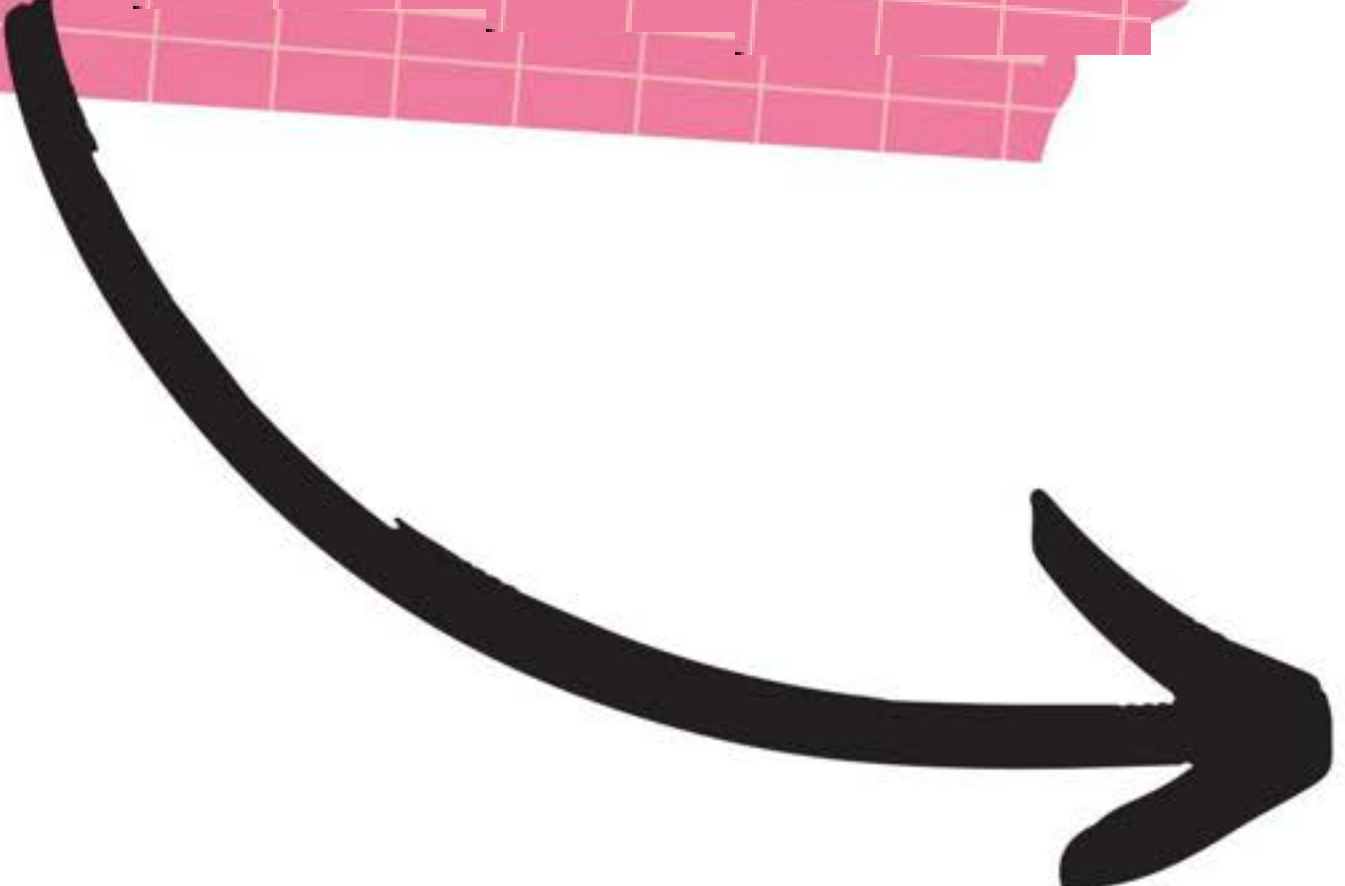

Culture of integrity

Anticorruption and Ethics - Integral Concepts

Anti-corruption and ethics are two concepts that closely intertwine and interact. Ethics is the foundation for the fight against corruption, since it is the deviation from moral principles and values that leads to corrupt actions. On the other hand, effective fight against corruption contributes to strengthening ethical norms in society.

Corruption is a violation of ethics:
Abuse of power, bribery and other manifestations of corruption are direct violation of ethical principles of justice, honesty and integrity

Ethics is the key to transparency: Applying ethical principles in everyday activities, especially in the public sector, promotes transparency and openness, which makes it more difficult to commit corrupt acts.
Culture of integrity is the basis of anticorruption: The formation of a culture of integrity in society is a long-term process that begins with the education of ethical values in young people and continues with systematic work in all spheres of life.

Anticorruption investigations



Situation: In a small town, an official responsible for issuing business licenses receives numerous applications from entrepreneurs

Escalation: After a successful deal with one entrepreneur, the official begins to demand bribes from others who also want to speed up the process. This becomes a regular practice.

The beginning of corruption: One of the entrepreneurs, wanting to speed up the process of obtaining license, offers a bribe to the official. The official initially refuses, but later realizes that it could make his job easier and accepts the offer.

Can this lead to regular corruption?

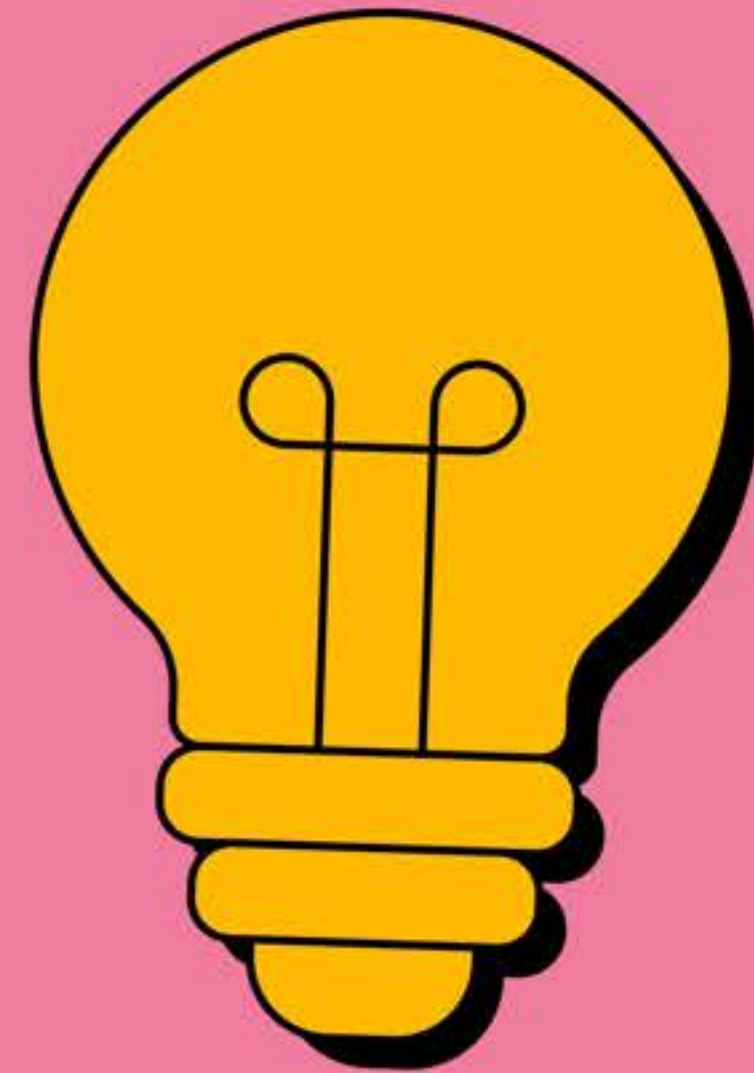

Cards for exercises (alternative option)

Hint: Discuss with a friend why honesty is an important trait. Ask yourself if your silence would be an endorsement of dishonest behavior.

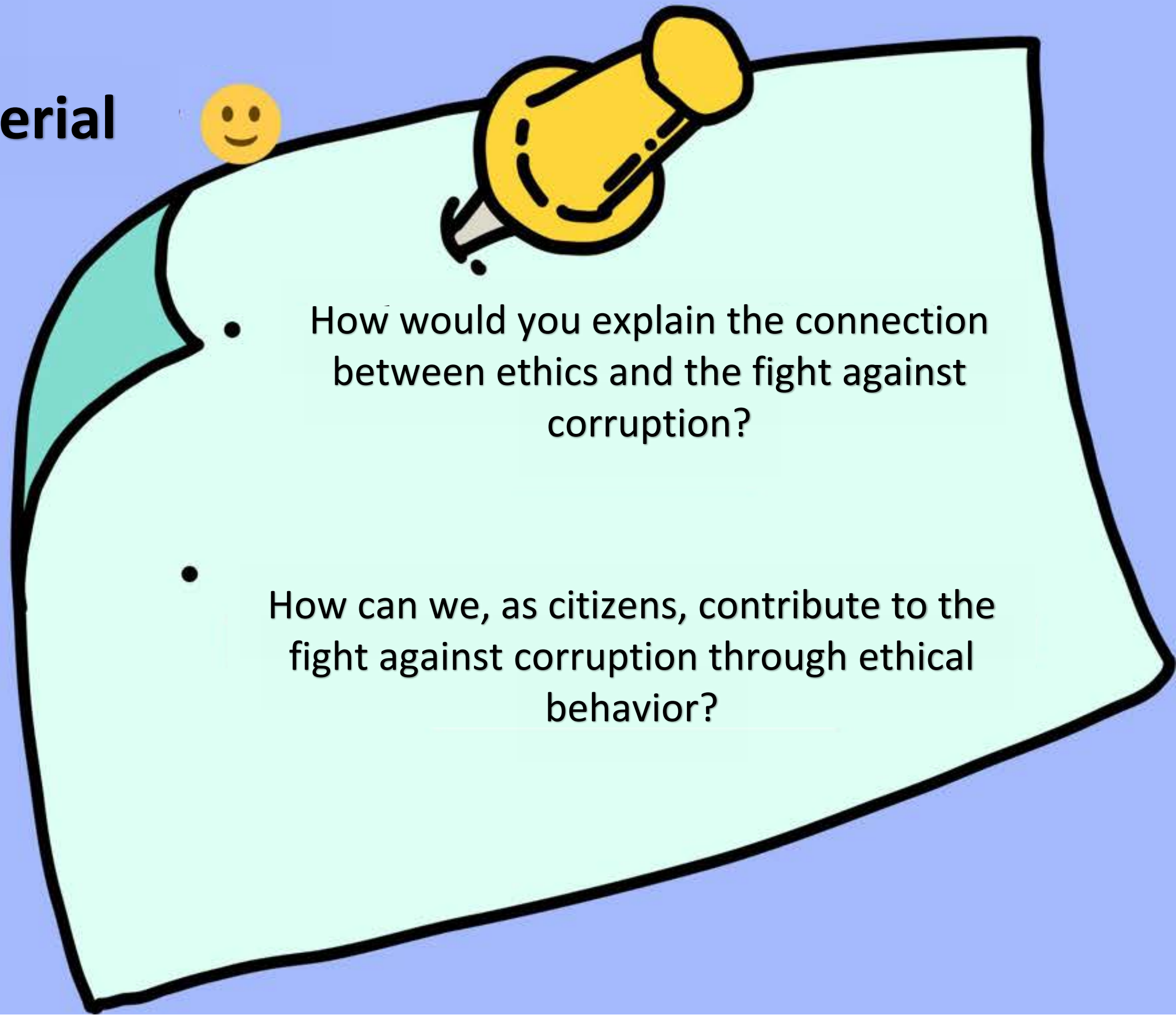
Ethical Choices: Honesty and accountability for your actions are the foundation of trust between people. Make choices that will help maintain justice.
